Since 2014 Lehman has performing lead roles at the Deutsche Oper Berlin including Valentin in *Faust*, the title role in *Il barbiere di Siviglia*, Guglielmo in *Cosi fan tutte*, Belcore in *L'elisir d'amore*, and recently made his debut at the Teatro Sao Carlos as Silvio in *I Pagliacci*. He made his professional operatic debut in 2010 as Guglielmo in *Cosi fan tutte* with the Delaware Valley Opera and also has appeared as a Studio Artist with the Chautauqua Opera.

Praised for his "pleasant, well-rounded voice," Lehman has performed solo in works by Bach, Britten, Dvořák, Orff, Beethoven, Schubert, Handel, Haydn, Schumann and others; the requiems of Duruflé, Mozart, and Brahms; and in pieces by contemporary composers including Ricardo Zohn-Muldoon and Arlene Sierra.

During the summer of 2014 Lehman was selected to participate in the Ravinia Festival's Steans Music Institute, where he worked with Dame Kiri Te Kawawa, Kevin Murphy, Patricia McCaffrey, Stephen King and other artists. One of four winners of the Opera Foundation Scholarships, Lehman won first place and the Lynne Clarke Vocal Prize at the 2010 Friends of Eastman Opera Competition. He earned degrees from Ithaca College and Eastman School of Music.
